

Cleveland Information and Rules

Behavior

The School Code of Behavior applies to the trip to Cleveland. Violation of the Code could result in an early return to Virginia at the Parents expense.

Luggage

One suitcase and a book bag

NO glass bottles, medicines, weapons, alcohol or drugs.

All bags will be searched before the trip.

Violation of any of these items at any time could result in a trip back home at the Parents expense.

Medicine

All medication must be turned in before the trip. A medical form must accompany the medicine. You may not carry medicine in your own personal bag. The exception is an asthma inhaler. Medicine will be collected when the students arrive.

Money

Money will be needed for three lunches, one dinner and souvenirs.

Cash, Visa, or American Express, gift credit card may be used.

Because of County rules there will be no swimming at the Hotel. Park water rides are okay, swimsuits **under clothing is okay.**

Required Clothing

Concert and Symphonic attire

BUS

Students will sign up for a bus and will be required to stay on that bus throughout the trip. NO switching buses after sign up.

Students will be checked on and off the buses throughout the trip by the chaperones. At short stops where only a few students get off the bus, they must always have a Chaperone accompany the student. Trash bags will be on all buses and students are expected to keep the buses clean while on the trip. Movies that are acceptable are rated G and PG no

R's. Chaperones will have a mini medical bag located on all three buses for the students.

Check-In

Upon arrival certain students will unload baggage from the buses.

Students will then collect their own baggage.

Room captains will be given the keys to the room. (The first name for each room.) The students have already signed up for their rooms. There will be NO room changes when we get to Cleveland. There could be some down time when we arrive at the Hotel. Students are expected to stay together and be on the quiet side of Life. Check-in and practice will begin at 3:00pm. The students will be divided in half and half of the students will check in and half will begin practice.

Hotel

Chaperones will have the medicines for the students.

Visual bed checks will be done at night by the Chaperones. All students are expected to stay in their rooms after this is done. This is for safety.

The student's rooms will be taped up after the bed check by the Chaperone. This is also for safety.

Chaperones will be assigned to hall duty after the kids go to bed. This is done so that the students get some sleep.

Wake up will be at 6:00am with a phone call and a knock on the door to follow. Visual check by the Chaperones will make sure everyone is up and getting ready.

The students are urged to keep their rooms clean. Things get lost and forgotten when the room is trashed.

The last night students will be expected to pack and clean the room.

Checkout will be the following morning. Chaperones will check the students out of the room one at a time. Students will not be allowed to leave without a clean room.

The Students should take note of their room number in case of an emergency.

Chaperones and Students

Students signed up for Chaperones. Prince William County rules state that students must be with a Chaperone at all times. Students will remain in groups with the Chaperone. At each event a location will be chosen so if a student should get separated from the group, He or she is to go to that location to meet up with a staff member or Chaperone

The Chaperone and group of students will go to the designated location to get lost student. The group will wait fifteen minutes for student. Students will face punishment if they leave their group and Chaperone.

Student Dress and Appearance

The following items are considered improper dress for the trip to Cleveland.

- . Sleeping Apparel**
- . Undergarments Worn as Outer Garments**
- . Sheer “See-Through” Garments**
- . Clothing with Lewd, Obscene, Patently Offensive, or sexually Suggestive Signs, Slogans, Pictures or Messages**
- . Garments which expose the Midriff**
- . Garments Which Are Too Revealing, Expose Undergarments, Are Excessively Tight and Form-Fitting or Which Have Very Low Necklines.**
- . Jewelry Or Other Items Which Could Be Regarded Or Used As A Weapon (I. E., Studded Belts Or Collars, Large Rings, Etc.**
- . Tops with Oversized Arm Openings, Strapless Tops, Halter Tops, Tube Tops and Tank Tops, The exception is Tube Tops and Tank Tops can be worn if another shirt is worn over the Tube and Tank Top.**
- . Bare Feet, Bedroom Slippers, Stockings/Socks Only**
- . Non-Jewelry Chains Attached to Clothing**

Students will be asked to change if Staff or a Chaperone finds the clothing inappropriate.

What to bring:

Sunscreen for the park, a camera for memories a hat, extra money, a light jacket or coat, a student ID or Drivers License.

Did you lose something?

Staff and Chaperones are not responsible for the student’s personal belongings.

All Students will eat Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner. Remember to drink plenty of fluids at the park.
